The Mini Summer Reading Challenge is a bite-sized version of the main Summer Reading Challenge and is designed especially for our youngest readers. Finding time each day to look at a book with your child is great for their development. It will help them learn to concentrate and understand new words. It's a lovely opportunity for some quiet cosy time together too!



Here's how the Mini Summer Reading Challenge works:

- Sign up for free at your local library to receive a collector card and stickers.
- Borrow any book of your choice to take home and read together.
- Add a sticker to the collector card each time you read a book.
- When you've read six books you will have completed the Mini Summer Reading Challenge – please ask the librarian for your special gold sticker and certificate!

Prize draw

When your child completes the Mini Summer Reading Challenge they'll be entered into a prize draw for a chance to win a fantastic goody bag. Each library will have its own lucky winner!
